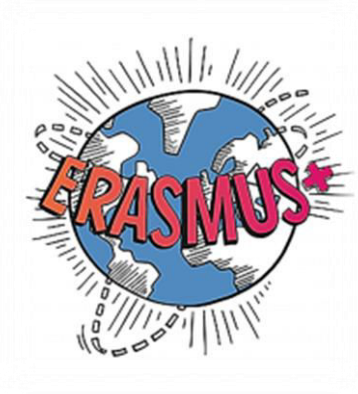

BASIC INFORMATION ABOUT THE IONIAN UNIVERSITY AND THE HISTORY DEPARTMENT

"The Ionian University was founded in 1984 in the historic and beautiful city of Corfu, a Unesco World Heritage Site, and until 2018 consisted of six departments (History, Foreign Languages and Translation, Music Studies, Library, Archival and Museum Studies, Audiovisual Arts, and Informatics) with five thousand undergraduate and more than six hundred postgraduate students. By incorporating and restructuring the Ionian Technological Education Institute, in the academic year 2019-2020 the Ionian University will expand to henceforth comprise a total of twelve departments

on four islands of the Ionian Sea (Corfu, Lefkada, Kefalonia, Zakynthos)... .

During its thirty-five years of operation, the Ionian University has created an important international academic and research profile, being a partner in many academic networks and collaborating with other Higher Education Institutions and research centers on a European and international level." (Prof. V. Chrissikopoulos, Rector, 2015-2020).

Having been under Venetian, French and English rule for a long period of time, the Ionian Islands followed a different historical path from the other Greek provinces, which after the fall of the Byzantine Empire in the 15th century became part of the Ottoman Empire until the 19th century and the beginning of the 20th, when these territories gradually gained their freedom and joined the newly established Greek state.

This different path brought the Ionian Islands closer to the western European ways of life and thinking, which, in turn, left their mark on the urban and rural landscape of the islands, on the mentality of the people and their customs. It should be noted that the first Greek University, the Ionian Academy, was founded in Corfu in 1824, which was then under English rule. From the first decades of the 19th century until their Union with the Greek State in 1864, the Ionian Islands became the cradle of a unique literary current, which largely contributed to the intellectual ferment of modern times.

The Department of History (<https://history.ionio.gr/>; history@ionio.gr), founded in the academic year 1985-86, is the oldest department of the Ionian University and the only one in Greece exclusively dedicated to the study of History. Along with the Department of Foreign Languages, Translation and Interpreting they constitute the Faculty of Humanities.

The Ionian University has been awarded the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education 2021-2027.

The course catalogue is renewed at the end of each Academic year (June-July). However, by clicking on 'Studies' and then on each course one can get a pretty good idea of at least the compulsory courses' content, taught every year, usually in the same semester. Additionally, Erasmus students can choose courses from a wide number of specialized courses and seminars.

The courses offered in the Department of History are accredited 5 ECTS with the exception of foreign languages and Informatics.

NOTE that you have to attend to a compulsory course on Modern Greek Language (offered by the Dept. of Foreign Languages, Translation & Interpreting), which gives you 6 ECTS.

Courses are taught in Greek. Most of the instructors offer incoming Erasmus students courses on a tutorial basis in one of the main European languages (usually in English or French, but also in Italian, Spanish or German). Students can choose to write essays on a chosen topic or sit the exams in one of the above-mentioned languages (depending on the instructor).

Academic Term

The overall duration of studies is eight semesters. Each academic year comprises two semesters, of 13 weeks each. An examination period of twenty days corresponds to each semester. There is a third examination period (for all courses) in September.

Winter semester:

COURSES: October 1st until mid January

EXAMINATIONS: mid January until first week of February

Christmas holidays: 2 weeks (December 23rd – January 6th)

Spring semester:

COURSES: second week of February until end of May

EXAMINATIONS: June

Easter holidays: 2 weeks
