- ***Portfolio of ongoing projects***
- ***2014 and 2015 Work Program, including orphan 2014 topics and "legacy"***

Approach

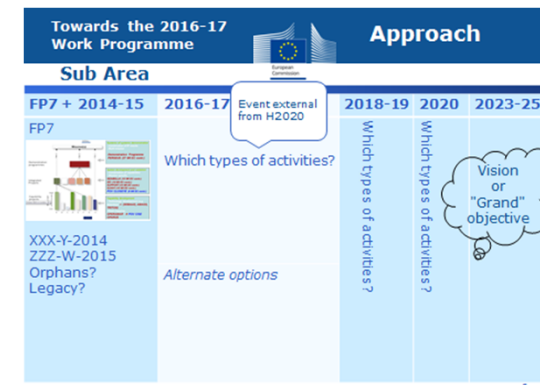
For each Area (e.g. BES) in the Scoping Paper: the Commission presents summary information

Then for each sub-area (e.g. "Maritime security" in BES):

- the Commission proposes a "perspective":

- the WG discusses the "perspective" using sub-area specific questionnaires:

- the Commission finalizes the perspective, which is then used to filter and frame the topics within the sub-area

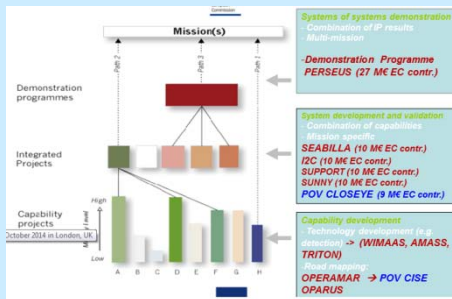
