They expressed continued support for the MONDIACULT process, including the development of policies acknowledging the contribution of culture to the fight against climate change, as well as intersectoral initiatives such as the ongoing development of a revised UNESCO Framework on Culture and Arts Education. The relevance of UNESCO's Creative Cities Network (UCCN) was also highlighted for fostering cultural and creative industries. Several Member States noted the celebration of the 20 th anniversary of the 2003 Convention next year, and efforts to advance the preservation and promotion of the cultures and languages of Indigenous Peoples. The fight against the illicit trafficking and restitution of cultural property is also a priority for several Member States. Following the numerous interventions from 55 Member States (during the morning and afternoon sessions), the Assistant Director-General for Culture provided additional information and thanked the Member States for the support expressed to the Draft Programme and Budget for 2024-2025. The two Member States took the floor to provide further information in relation to the rationale of the amendment. 30 Member States took the floor and stressed the relevance of strengthening the implementation of the 2015 Recommendation, including by harnessing digital technologies for the development of digital inventories and databases to map cultural objects as well as through educational initiatives, in cooperation with communities and other institutions. They expressed general support to the amendments, which highlight the role of museums in the fight against illicit trafficking and return restitution of cultural property in line with the 2022 MONDIACULT Declaration. Following the discussion on the amendments and proposals of slight adjustments to the text, it was agreed that the oral report of the Chairperson of the Culture Commission to the General Conference mention that the approval of this amendment does not express new commitments of Member States beyond the MONDIACULT Declaration.
